YOU CHOOSE what tees you prefer to play. This only applies to men as ladies will play off the red tees. For men, the choice is yellow or white and those playing off white add two stableford points to their score.

Each competitor may only play once.

Generous prizes in the form of Pro-Shop vouchers will be awarded to the top three men and top two ladies.
