Gillas set up for a great final

Chris Ramsey followed up his win in Round 1 of the Gillas Cup a couple of weeks back by winning Round 2 on Sunday. His score of 40 points was just enough to beat Kevin Hopwood on count-back to take first place while Tim Palmer with 38 points beat Darren Boulton, also on count-back, to take third spot. This result sets up a very close and open final to be played next Sunday, the last major competition to be decided this year.

Normally a three qualifying round competition, this year the Gillas Cup is curtailed to just two to accommodate rescheduling of the Crawford Cup due to bad weather.

This means that competitors will take just one score, the best of Rounds 1 and 2 into the final. Chris Ramsey and Mark Ridgill will lead the way with the 43 points they scored in Round 1, closely followed by Kevin Hopwood on 40 points and Chris Hunt on 39. The danger to the leaders doesn't end there however as Patrick Wilmore, Mark Ramos, Darren Boulton and Tim Palmer pursue closely on 38 while there are no less than 18 players within seven points of the lead. Whoever wins will have to play well!
