
Ladies lose at home

Get competitive

TTNB advises how to maintain and regain a competitive handicap

IT IS WIDELY understood that to maintain a competitive handicap a player must return a minimum of three qualifying scores in a year. What is not so well known is that those scores must be returned in the current calendar year.

Clause 25.1 of the CONGU manual clearly states:

"...... If a player fails to meet this minimum requirement of Qualifying Scores in any calendar year the Competition Handicap status is lost."

The emphasis here is on the words 'calendar year'.

So, to retain or regain a competitive handicap, you must return three qualifying scores within the current calendar year. These

scores can be from nine or 18 hole qualifying competitions or supplementary scores. If you take the latter route please don't forget that you must register that you are returning a supplementary score in the pro-shop before the round.

So, to summarise: if you enter a new calendar year with a competitive handicap, that handicap will last for that year. If you fail to return three qualifying scores in that year you will lose your competition handicap status on January 1 the following year and to regain it you must return three qualifying scores in that new year. You should plan accordingly.

Strong campaign but M4 journey ends



Herbie's back Trophy for Liddiard reinstated

MEMBERS of certain longevity will remember Herbie Sternberg, a large and larger than life character who was a member during the 1980s.

He donated the Herbie Sternberg Trophy in 1985 and it was first competed for in 1986, the year he returned to his native Australia.

It is to be reinstated this year and will be awarded to the player with the highest total of their five best stableford scores in the nine-hole Liddiard qualifiers.

Qualifiers can be played anytime on Wednesday, just book in the pro-shop before you play. You need a score of 19 to qualify for the final, an 18-hole qualifier, to be played on July 31.
