Rob sets the standard

Rob Bridgeman won a high scoring men's midweek stableford on Tuesday May 28 with 41 points. Dave Gentleman was second with 38 while Chris Terrett scored 37 points to beat Roger Gaskell on countback and take third place.

It's that man again

John (Chopper) Harris celebrated the arrival of June by winning the men's Saturday stableford for the second week in succession. His score of 39 points was two ahead of Phil Clare who took second spot while Nick Jones with 35 won a three-way tie on count-back with Kevin Good and Greg Collins to be placed third.

Jane takes ladies' medal

On the same day, Jane Brackenbury scored a gross 82, net 75 to win the ladies' medal, Mary Harwood was second with gross 102, net 82 while Tina Mulford with net 85 beat Georgie Seaman on countback to take third place.

Carl takes men's medal

There was a three-way tie on net 75 for first place in Division 1 of the men's June medal with Carl McCartney, gross 87, taking first place followed by Jason Kendal, gross 78, and Richard Bower 84. Kevin Holland won Division 2 with gross 88, net 72 followed by Keith Wilkins on net 74 and Lee Nicholson was a further shot back in third place.

In Division 3 count-back was required to resolve a four-way tie on net 79 in the order of Daniel Duncan, Darren Galbraith, Nick Jones and Tom Wickstead.

John best of three

Inclement weather kept the entry to the men's midweek medal on Monday June 3 to just three entries. John Harrod, playing off 27, won the event with gross 99, net 72, a fine score in the conditions that would have beaten much larger fields. Ian Haines and James Hirst followed him home in second and third place.

Carole's stableford

Carole Tancock won the ladies' stableford competition held on Tuesday June 4. She scored 33 points, winning on count-back from Nicolette E as two od while Jane Wilmore came third with 32 points.

Meanwhile, the Central Sevens team won $4\frac{1}{2}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ away to Rye Hill while it was honours even for the seniors when they countered a 4-2 defeat away to Drayton Park earlier in the season by winning at home by the same score. The seniors also played at Marlborough on Thursday June 6 when they lost by $4\frac{1}{2}$ to $1\frac{1}{2}$.
