Jason and Kevin take Badger




Tina wins in the sunshine

TTNB Rules Guru

Another question from a reader

Dear TTNB Rules Guru

A FEW days ago I was playing the ninth hole from the white tees and mishit my tee shot into the bushes on the right and so played a provisional.

We found a ball that may well have been mine but brambles and other shrubbery prevented us from reaching it. The ball was the same make and type as mine and had a mark similar to the one I use for identification.

However, I decided that I could not claim that ball was mine as I was only about 60% sure so I could not take a drop under penalty.

The question then was: could I play my provisional ball? I was more than 50% sure that I had found my original so it was most likely that the provisional was not in play.

I decided that I could not play the provisional but that was fairly easy as we were playing match play. It would have been a more difficult decision if it had been a medal and the decision would involve the dreaded walk back.

Please advise (i) what was the correct procedure and (ii) if I had been able to clearly identify my ball but could not reach it, could I have taken a drop under penalty with another ball?
