THE FINAL round of the Gillas Cup played yesterday (Sunday) was a close run thing as was the final placing of the overall winner of the three round competition.

Paul Barton's winning round in the final took him up the leader board into a three-way tie with Christy Whelehan and Keith Wilkins with Paul taking third place on count-back.

A Rules update to brighten up November and beyond

IN 1844 the English poet, Thomas Hood, wrote:

No shade, no shine, no butterflies, no bees, No fruits, no flowers, no leaves, no birds, -November!

This month also has its difficulties for golfers. Soggy underfoot, a generous coating of fallen leaves and, every now and then, an unfriendly and potentially card-wrecking embedded lie.

But it's worth reminding ourselves of the new rules introduced in January. Under the old rules, relief from an embedded lie was limited to closely mown areas and it was only by local rules that this could be extended to other areas.

Rule 16.3 under the new rules gives relief for a ball embedded anywhere in the 'general area' (the new term for 'through the green'). A Local Rule restricting relief to areas cut to fairway height can be introduced but it is thought that it is very unlikely that any club will do so.

So if a ball is embedded off the fairway it may be cleaned and dropped within one club length not nearer the hole.
