Changes to booking rules

IN ORDER to maximise the effective capacity of the course the rules and conditions for booking tee times are under constant review. From Tuesday May 26 the rules are:

Tee times will be at eight minute intervals.

- Members can book seven days ahead and book two tee times in any one week commencing on a Monday.
- Members can also telephone the Pro-shop to book to play 'on the day' subject to availability.

The rules will be modified depending upon government advice and to suit local safety standards.

WHS will unite the six current handicap indexes in operation around the world into one global system and it will affect the way we all play our golf both at home and away.

Bob Williams July 9 1950 - May 12 2020

BOB WILLIAMS died peacefully at home on Tuesday May 12 2020 at the age of 69 after suffering for many years with motor neurone disease.

A fine golfer who had played off a handicap of nine, Bob was a popular and valued member of West Berks for over 20 years. During this time he was our senior champion in 2007 and 2008 and he also won the Classic Trophy with Nigel Pimbley in 1999 and in 2007 the Crawford Cup and the Clama Trophy with Pete Curtis.

He served on the committee as handicap secretary in 2009, and later in that year took over as treasurer, a role in which he served the club so well until 2012.

Bob was a qualified accountant and worked for ICL for many years until he set up his own company offering IT and accounting services. Bob was also a lecturer in accounting at Newbury College.

A man of many interests, in addition to golf Bob was passionate about all sports. He was a season ticket holder at Reading FC and loved watching cricket. He was also a keen steam train enthusiast.

Bob joined WBGC with his first wife, Sharron and son Matt. Unfortunately,

Sharron died suddenly at the club in June 2011 and she is remembered to this day with the Sunshine Cup, a competition played every year in her memory.

Bob married Jan in 2014 shortly after he was diagnosed with MND in 2013. Jan provided valuable support to Bob and bore that responsibility with great fortitude and resolution. Bob also demonstrated remarkable courage and strength as I witnessed on the many occasions I met them in the coffee shops of Newbury and on the towpath of the canal.

Bob and Jan also shared a passion for pub quizzes at which Bob has a reputation of being something of a whiz. Jan used to organise and chair Quiz Nights at both the club and local pubs.

We send our sincere condolences to Jan, Bob's son Matt, daughter Sarah and four grandchildren. He will be much missed by them, as indeed he will by all his friends at WBGC.

Bob's funeral is at West Barks Crematorium on Thursday May 28 at 11



o'clock. Because of the prevailing lockdown conditions only ten family members are allowed in the crematorium but some of his close friends intend to stand on the approach road to say farewell while maintaining social distancing.
