WE ARE pleased to announce that the bar area will be open from July 4 following new government guidelines.

Please read very carefully the following message, sent out by email to all members on Tuesday June 30, as continued use of this facility will depend on how members react to the demands of social distancing.

Members' Update

We are pleased to advise following a further relaxation of Government guidelines that the clubhouse bar facilities will be re-opened on Saturday the 4th July under the following conditions:

1. The clubhouse and patio area will be laid out to accommodate social distancing and table and chairs should not be moved under any circumstances. Also please note that the dining room remains closed until further notice.

2. Payment for drinks should be by contactless card wherever possible.

REMINDERS

1. "Roll-ups" in terms of congregating before and after play are still not permitted and arrival/departure timings as previously advised should be adhered to as far as possible.

2. The 10 minute tee interval time should be fully respected so preventing groups congregating on the first tee and causing congestion on the course.

The owners wish it to be brought to member's attention that anyone who has not renewed their membership for 2020/2021 are not permitted to use the course.

Comps – how you can help

CLOSING DOWN competitions is a demanding job at the best of times but under post-lockdown restraints the score entry screen is unavailable to competitors and so all scores have to be entered after the competition by the comps' boys.

However, there is a way in which you can help by using a new facility called '**Today's Golf**' within **HowDidiDo** that allows you to enter your own score.

This can be done by mobile immediately after the match or later if you take a copy or photograph of your card home. Please do not take your card with you. This must be completed, signed and placed in the competition box as soon as practical after the round or you will be disqualified.

To enter your score you open HowDidiDo and select '*Today's Golf*'. The next screen will list '*leaderboard*' 'sign in' and 'score input'. All you have to do is to click 'score input' and enter your gross score and the system will do the rest. When you've entered all 18 holes click on the 'finish' tab and that's job done.

It will take you minutes but your action will be greatly appreciated by the comps' boys as it will save them hours.

PS One more favour while we are at it. Would you please remember to print your name in capital letters on the card as a signature is rarely recognisable.
