Results update from West Berks

Last word on club champs

We reported the results of the men's and ladies' championship and the Wise Trophy in last week's issue but at the time we did not have the ratified result of the Bennett Cup, the gross competition for men with handicaps over 19.

The winner was Lloyd Ponsford who, with rounds of 72 on both Saturday and Sunday, won by four shots from Liam McCullough who shot 74 on both days. Muz Mzouri took third spot with rounds of 81 and 78.

The reason for the delay in announcing the result was that there was a dispute about a ruling during Lloyd's round on Saturday.

The issue concerned Lloyd's decision to play a provisional ball having already started searching for the original. As the situation was not certain the comp secretaries adopted the correct procedure and sought advice from the BB&O. The rules officials at BB&O advised that Rule 18.3 applies, that there was no infringement and Lloyd was declared a worthy as well as a clear winner.

Sean Sheils won the men's midweek stableford on Monday September 7 with 38 points winning on count-back from Kim Potter who took second spot while Charles Overton with 36 points beat Brian Davis on count-back to take third place.

Face covering in pro-shop

Face coverings are now required when entering the proshop. If you do not have a face covering access will be denied.

Local Rule - bunkers with no rakes

We are all aware that rakes have been removed from bunkers and of the difficulty of smoothing sand with feet and clubs.

Under a new local rule: when a player's ball lies in any bunker, the player may take free relief once by placing the original ball within six inches from where the ball came to rest. It must be within the bunker and no nearer the hole. The ball should not be cleaned and the area of sand cannot be smoothed before placing.

Please note: if your ball is in the face of a bunker it has to be placed as near as possible to where it came to rest and not allowed to roll down to the bottom of the bunker under its own weight.
