This competition is now reduced from four rounds to three and ten players take 40 points or more into the final on Sunday December 13 with Shaun Ponsford leading the way thanks to his 45 in the first round. All will be revealed on Sunday.

Block bookings of tee times

A motion that requested block tee times to restart roll ups was proposed by Roger Gaskell and seconded by Rob Small. This motion was carried by 30 votes to 16.

Following the AGM, the course owner, Bournebridge Golf, has received a number of requests from other groups in addition to those represented at the AGM and has decided to place a restriction on block booked tee times as is its right under the licence agreement between Bournebridge and WBGC. The company believes that under the present circumstances, if all requests were accommodated it would result in a disproportionate number of tees being prebooked to the detriment of those who are not part of a group.

Bournebridge has further advised that the company is not averse to block booked tee times per se, and wholly supports 'roll ups' in the manner in which they previously operated and has agreed that the matter should be re-visited by both the General Committee and the company sometime next year when deemed appropriate.

David Grenier August 12 1931 - November 6 2020

NO DOUBT by now you will have read the TTNB News Announcement sent out on November 17 or heard from some other source that David Grenier died on November 6 2020. Although the suspension of golf did not allow TTNB to cover this sad news at the time, the delay does nothing to diminish the sincerity of this message.

David, who was 89, was a long-time, highly respected member of West Berks and was very popular with both fellow members and staff at the club and in particular with SAGGS, a group in which he played for many years.

He became a highly successful member of the financial community and ran his own investment company for many years. He was also a trustee of a number of pension schemes until quite recently.

When not working, David enjoyed many other interests including politics, the arts, music and, in particular, opera. Always a keen sportsman, he was a great rugby union fan and a long-term supporter of Wasps RFC.

An enthusiastic golfer, David had numerous lessons with Paul over the past 20 years or so and Paul sums up the feeling of all those who knew him at West Berks when he said: "David was always keen to improve his golf and striving for an extra 20 yards to keep up with his friends in SAGGS. He was a real gentleman and it was a great pleasure to teach and get to know him."

The response to the news of David's death from all sectors of the club, and SAGGS in particular, was as warm as it was sincere. He is described as someone who was shrewd and intelligent, a delightful golfing companion and a valued contributor to the SAGGS pre-golf debates. He is much missed by everyone who knew him at the club. Once again we offer our sincere condolences to his wife, Janet, and his sons, Lewis, Julian and Michael.

A Master class Fink Wright reflects on the Masters

Hi all and I hope you guys in the UK are now getting back into the swing of playing golf again.

Although the Masters finished a while ago now it is still a talking point over here. Apart from the unusual silence of the place, there were a couple of truly standout examples of how strong in the head these guys are.

The first was Dustin Johnson's outstanding win by five clear shots. DJ had what could have been an unsettling start on Sunday when Im Sung-jae closed to within a couple of shots. But DJ has the best possible attitude for the game, lets nothing phase him and he does just what is required and concentrates on the next shot. I couldn't help comparing that with just a couple of weeks back when I asked a young, very promising, college golfer who is under my wing, how he managed to fluff a chip on the ninth hole in an amateur tournament. He said that a photographer had spooked him on the eighth tee and he couldn't get it out of his mind. Out of his mind? It wouldn't have even entered the mind of DJ or any of the other top guys out there.

Then there was Tiger Woods. Tiger struggled all week and calamity struck on the twelfth hole on Sunday. A par three of a fraction over 150 yards, he went in the water three times and racked up a ten. That would have destroyed a lot of golfers, but not Tiger. Now I have never worked with Tiger and never gotten to know him real well but you just have to admire the strength of mind and self-pride at work there. It made no material difference to him whether he finished in the top 50 or the top 150 but he finished with five birdies in the last six holes – truly remarkable. And my college boy allowed a photographer to spook him. He'll learn – I'll make sure of that.
